

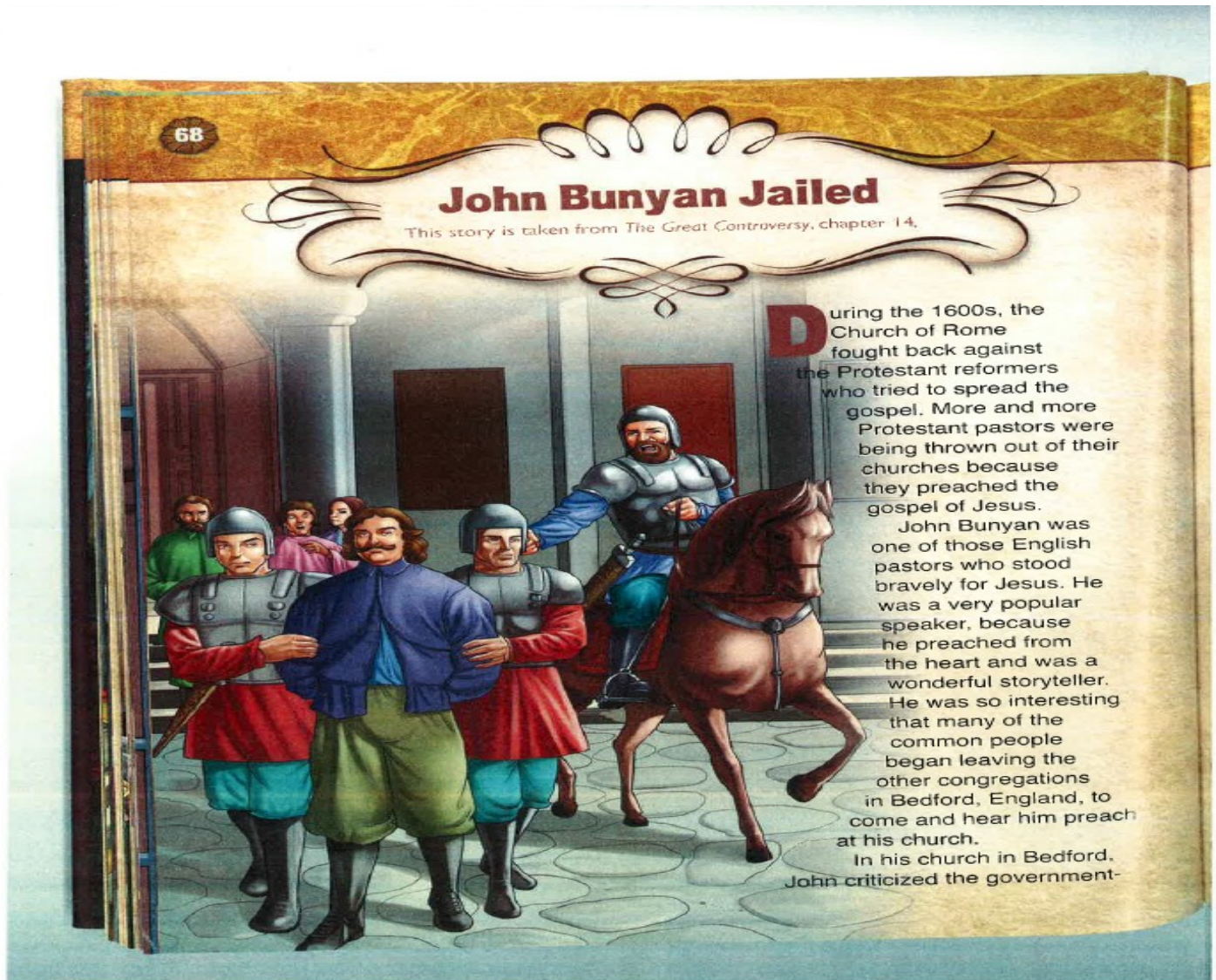

run church, telling everyone that church leaders had no right to tell people what to believe and how and when they should worship. He went on to tell them that only God's grace could save them.

John was not liked by the priests in the Church of England. Eventually they convinced the local magistrate that he was breaking the law and needed to be jailed.

So during one of his weekly sermons, the constable came right into John's church and arrested him. The Bedford jail became his home, where he spent a great deal of time during the next 12 years. Many criminals were in that prison, and at first it was hard for John. Then he decided to make the best use of his time by preaching to the men, sometimes 40 or 50 at a time. With John in the prison cell, it seemed that heaven was very near, and soon many were giving their hearts to Jesus.

John would stay in prison for three or four months at a time. But he was such a friendly person that everyone loved him, and eventually the jailer would just send him home. The priests and magistrate would try to keep him there, but the jailer sympathized with John. "How can a man like Mr. Bunyan be trouble for the law?" he would always say.

The magistrate would tell John that he could stay out of jail if he would only stop his preaching. But John would not do this. Sooner or later they would come looking for him and send him back to jail again.

On one occasion when John had been sent home, a local priest happened to walk by his home and saw him through an open window with his family. He knew that John was supposed to be in jail, so he sent word to the magistrate that he might want to check the jail to see if John was actually there.

Meanwhile, John was at home eating the evening meal with his family. However, he was impressed that he should go back to the jail for the evening. So when supper was over, he headed back to the Bedford jail and locked himself in his cell as he always did, without even bothering to tell the jailer.

About an hour later the magistrate showed up with the priest to make an inspection as the priest had asked. "Good evening, warden!" they said cheerfully. "Are all your prisoners doing well?"

"Yes," the warden said, wondering what they might be up to.

"Is John Bunyan here as well?"

During one of his weekly sermons, the constable came right into John's church and arrested him.

"Yes, he is," the jailer replied, knowing that it wasn't true and that he was probably going to get into trouble because of his habit of letting John out.

"Well, let's see him then," the magistrate ordered.

The jailer got his keys and walked the two men to John's cell. There to his surprise he found the prisoner reading a book by candlelight.

When supper was over, John headed back to the Bedford jail and locked himself in his cell as he always did.

The priest was surprised, and the magistrate was not at all happy with the priest.

After the two visitors left, the jailer stopped by John's cell again. "That was a close call," he sighed with relief. "I was shocked to find you in your cell! I thought that you were home with your family!"

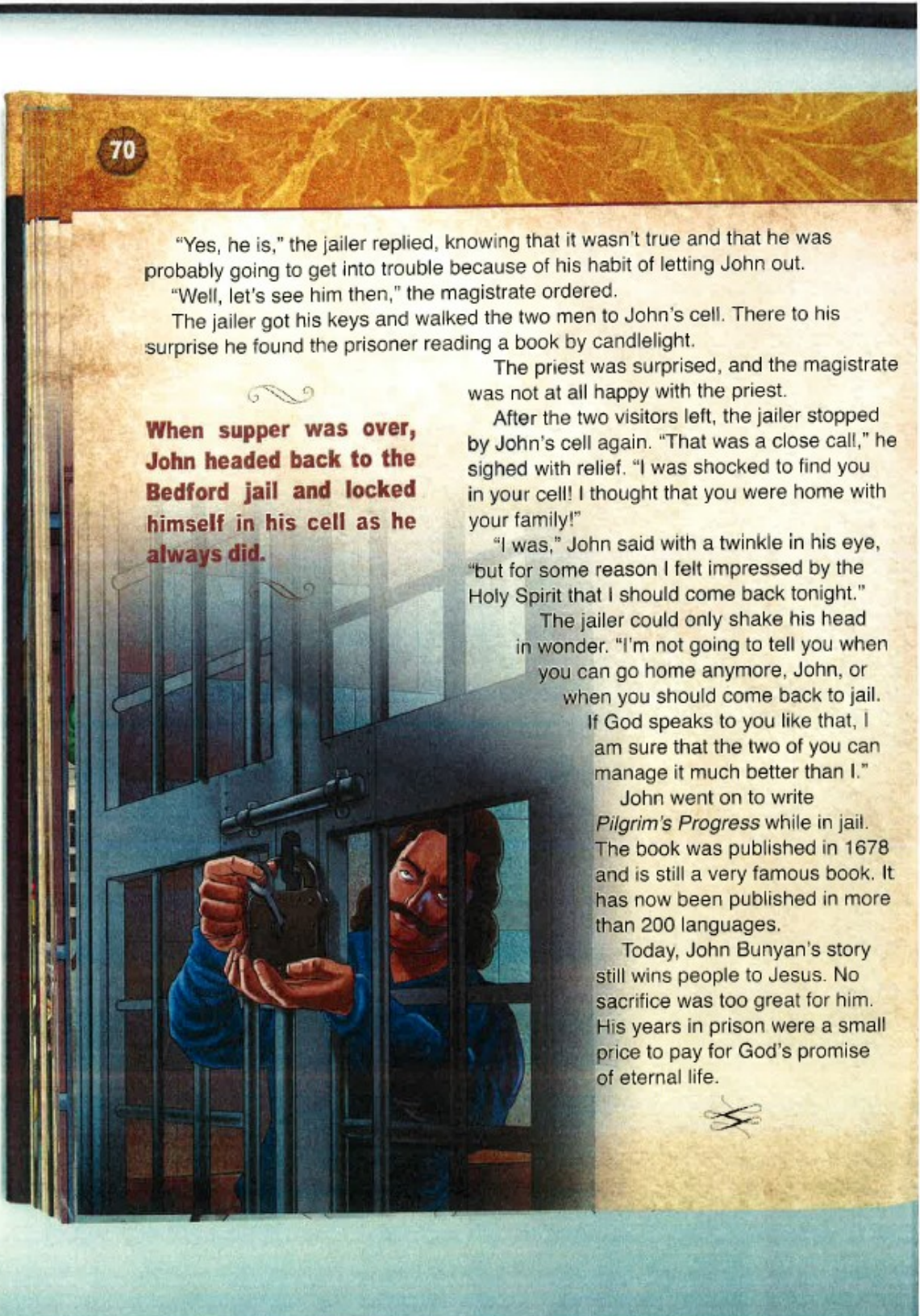
"I was," John said with a twinkle in his eye, "but for some reason I felt impressed by the Holy Spirit that I should come back tonight."

The jailer could only shake his head in wonder. "I'm not going to tell you when you can go home anymore, John, or when you should come back to jail.

If God speaks to you like that, I am sure that the two of you can manage it much better than I."

John went on to write *Pilgrim's Progress* while in jail. The book was published in 1678 and is still a very famous book. It has now been published in more than 200 languages.

Today, John Bunyan's story still wins people to Jesus. No sacrifice was too great for him. His years in prison were a small price to pay for God's promise of eternal life.
